AU provides the full spectrum of Air Force education, from pre-commissioning to the highest levels of professional military education (PME), including degree granting and professional continuing education (PCE) for officers, enlisted, and civilian personnel throughout their careers.

The University's PME programs educate Airmen on the capabilities of air, space, and cyberspace power and their role in national security. These programs focus on the knowledge and abilities needed to develop, employ, command, and support air, space, and cyberspace power at the highest levels. PCE programs provide scientific, technological, managerial, and other professional education to develop expertise necessary to meet the needs of the Air Force. AU conducts research in air, space, and cyberspace power, education, leadership, and management.

The University also provides citizenship programs and contributes to the development and testing of Air Force doctrine, concepts, and strategy.
