## **EMBLEM SIGNIFICANCE**

The colors blue and golden yellow are representative of the Air Force. The V-shaped design is stylized to represent flight connecting through logistics represented by the gear. The red lightning bolts are symbolic of readiness and Air Force Communications Command. The gear with the star and red disc is from the historical shoulder insignia, approved 16 June 1947, and is symbolic of the technical air missions performed by the Air Force Logistics Command in service to the advancement of air power for our country's freedom.

The 1819th Airways and Air Communications Service Group was designated on 15 July 1954 and organized on 1 September 1954 at Chanute AFB, Illinois, assigned to the 1800th AACS Wing. Redesignated Headquarters, 1819th AACS Group on 1 December 1954. Redesignated HQ Midwestern AACS Region on 1 November 1957 and HQ Midwestern Communications Region on 1 July 1961, assigned to Air Force Communications Service. Discontinued and inactivated on 1 July 1963. Headquarters, Midwestern Communications Region redesignated Headquarters, Logistics Information Systems Division on 10 December 1985 and activated on 1 January 1986, at Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, assigned to Air Force Communications Command. Redesignated Headquarters Logistics Communications Division 1 November 1986.
