The Air Force Contract Law Center provides legal services and advice to AFLC and other commands with respect to contract appeals, patents, and procurement law. The AFCLC provides a full range of contract law services to many Wright-Patterson units including the Air Force Acquisition Logistics Center, the International Logistics Center, the Wright-Patterson Contracting Center, and the Air Force Contract Maintenance Center. Also served by the center are the Air Force Institute of Technology, the Air Force Systems Command's Aeronautical Systems Division and Foreign Technology Division, and the Wright aeronautical laboratories located at Wright--Patterson AFB.

The Contract Law Center serves Air Force contracting officers worldwide. The center's commander considers mistake-in-bid claims from all Air Force commands and may allow withdrawal or correction of bids. The CLC's Directorate of Acquisition Law Services approves bid and performance bonds and reviews doubtful claims and large dollar ratification actions from other commands as well as AFLC. The Directorate of Contract Appeals reviews all Air Force contracting officers' proposed final decisions and represents the United States in all Air Force legal disputes before the Armed Services Board of Contract Appeals.
