OPERATIONS

The 42 Security Police Squadron was in charge with round the clock security of Loring AFB. Security forces in the squadron are responsible for providing continuous security for B-52, KC-135, and F-15 aircraft, and other priority resources, assigned to the 42 Bombardment Wing. Protection is provided 24 hours a day, seven days a week, to maintain mission readiness. The law enforcement section provides continuous protection for the installation's resources. Their mission includes entry/exit control, traffic control, civil disturbances control, confinement, and investigative functions. Additionally, the unit provides complete base support in administrative security, resources protection, combat arms and registration services.
